Proven Principles of Successful Travel Management Programs

- Start with a conceptual plan of a route system that will satisfy current and projected visitor and agency expectations.
- Establish clear goals and objectives of the route system.
- Create Route Management Objectives for all travel ways identified in conceptual plan.
- Evaluate all routes to assess value to system.
- Resolve any resource issues pertinent to route system.
- Plan for a wide range of opportunities and experiences.
- Use loop routes and destinations.
- Focus on quality of experience offered.
- Provide adequate route mileage and dispersal.
- Envision a system that provides flow, dispersal and connectivity.
- Plan support facilities (trailheads, staging areas, maintenance centers, etc.)
- Retain selected routes for future additions to system.
- Use all available techniques, concepts, technology and expertise to mitigate and resolve concerns and issues.
